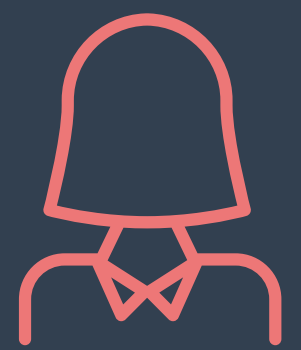

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81%

of employees have suggested ideas to improve on the current ways of doing things in their department

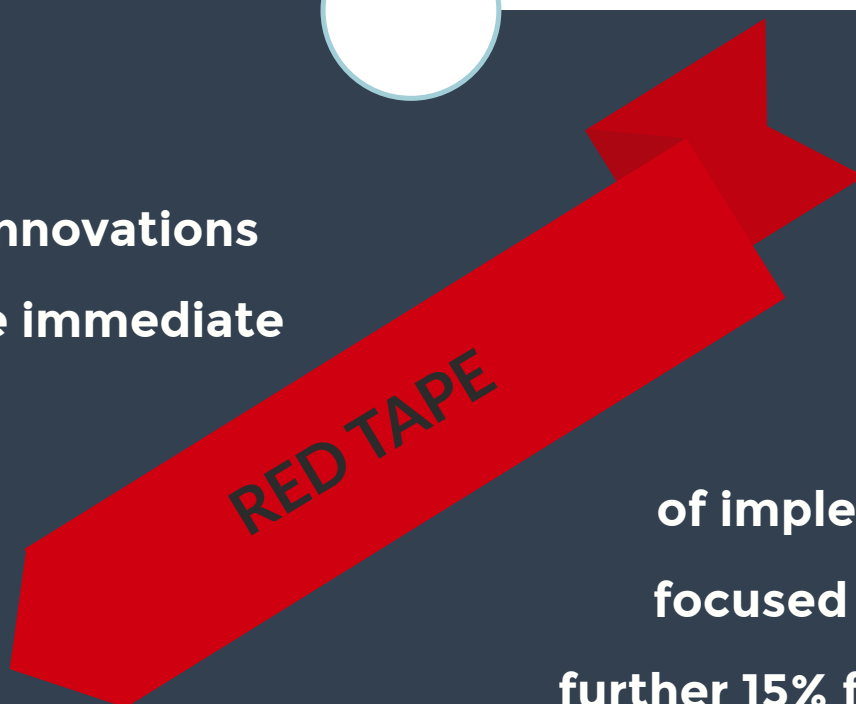


79%

of employees believe that innovation and new practices are part of our work

75%

of all implemented innovations were targeted at the immediate workgroup or department/agency



62%

of implemented innovations focused on processes with a further 15% focused on products

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20%
